Chess promotes:

- 1.Gender equality, as men and women can play under the same conditions.
- 2.Inter-generation relationships, because youngsters can play with elderly people.
- 3. Mental gymnastics (to prevent neuro-degenerative illnesses as Alzheimer).
- 4. Fight against racial prejudices, as it is a game associated with intelligence.
- 5. Its generalized practice, as it is economic (just a chessboard and a set of pieces).




