It was a very important day for him because he was starting chess classes today.



Values education consists of designing learning processes which permit students to construct their own values scale in a rational and autonomous way.

These values are not presented here as abstract concepts, but through the use of activities extracted from daily life, so that children can relate them to their own lives.

This methodology works on the intrapersonal and interpersonal intelligences simultaneously, helping to understand one's own feelings as well as other people's feelings.

Respect

This value means much more than just respecting the rules, as we also use this value when showing love and appreciation to others or when valuing the things we have.

We can show respect to other people, to ourselves and to our environment.

The key in the search for respect is not in our intelligence, but in our hearts: appreciation and love for others.
